 - Black Start and Restoration Principles followed by a black start exercise on the Brick simulator - Black Start Alaska, Stability

We plan to send out registration forms in August. Registration will cost \$NZ350. Registration includes all training, a reception Monday night, breakfasts, lunches, morning and afternon teas on meeting days plus the banquet on Thursday evening. This represents good value.
